Triennial Training Exercise 2018

Training exercises to handle the unknown emergency situation are standard practice for every first response and governmental agency. On February 13, 2018, the Orlando Sanford International Airport served as the site of a multi-agency response and recovery event involving an aircraft crash—*A Fowl Morning*.

Thirteen organizations, their personnel, equipment and hundreds of volunteers participated in the following simulated activities: Operational Coordination, On Scene Security and Protection, Fire Management and Suppression, Mass Critical Care Services, Operational Communications and Critical Transportation.

The simulated emergency was a Super Jet 123, MD 80 aircraft carrying 165 passengers is struck by a bird causing engine failure and a crash on the runway at OSIA resulting in multiple wounded passengers.

The result—a very successful team-building effort of planning coordination. Hopefully, one effort that will never be needed in reality, but prepared and planned nonetheless.


\$60 Million Terminal Expansion Underway

The notice to proceed was issued May 2, 2018 with an expected completion date of December, 2020 for the largest expansion project at OSIA to date.

This innovative and dramatic Airport reconstruction and reconfiguration of the existing terminal footprint, with infrastructure upgrades and added passenger service areas, will offer travelers greater efficiency and create capacity for more airline service and additional routes.
